SC stays Madras HC's order on property increase

Chennai, Aug 6: The Supreme Court has stayed a Madras High Court order that set aside a Tamil Nadu government circular which increased the guideline value of properties in cities like Chennai, Madurai, and Coimbatore by

The interim order was issued on Monday by a bench comprising Justice BV Nagarathna and Justice Nongmeikapam Kotiswar Singh, following an appeal by the Tamil Nadu government challenging

On March 6, a division bench of the Madras High Court had directed the state to adhere to the guideline value fixed in 2017 until the valuation committee revises the values following the due procedure of

The court clarified that documents already registered during the interim period are excluded from this directive, and no refunds of the stamp duty already paid would be entertained.

The order came while disposing of an appeal filed by the Tamil Nadu government against a single judge's order dated December 8, 2023.

The high court emphasized that administrative decisions must not be arbitrary.

The single judge had noted that while the government has the authority to increase the guideline value, it must follow the procedure outlined in the rules, which include the formation of an expert committee and a public hearing before implementing any hike.
